Friday, October 6th Dombalis Hall 7:00 p.m.

Our kick-off event is a Welcoming Reception generously being hosted by our Philoptochos. Abundant refreshments will be served, snapshots of yesteryear will be shown on two screens and brief presentations will be made by our own Fr. John Constantine, Chris N. Dombalis and our nonagenarian Finnie Theofanos.

Saturday, October 7th. Tours and Gala

Our curator par excellence Sylvia Evans will put on her other hat as professional tour guide and offer tours as shown below. Join her to learn more about these meaningful venues.

September Parish Council Update

Steve Julies reported that stewardship and over all income remain slightly ahead of last **year's pace, and that expenses** except for higher utilities remain within the budgeted amounts.

Maria Reed shared the building report as submitted by Mike Pantele. The floors in the Dombalis Hall have been refinished. A persistent ceiling leak from the roof is being addressed. Other stained ceiling tiles have been replaced. Quotes from three paint contractors for painting the first floor have been received and are being evaluated.

Maria Bartz gave an update on our 100th Anniversary activity. The presentation on Thomas

Jefferson and Greece sponsored by Paideia was well received. Plans are being finalized for all the events on GALA weekend of October 6th – 8th.

Suggested upgrades for better internet access in the Hellenic Center was presented by Lambros Deligan of the IT Committee and passed.

Under old business, work continues on upgrading our Cathedral website. A program offered by the Archdiocese looks promising since it can be maintained internally, is both user and mobile device friendly.

For new business, many members have responded to the **appeal to help Avo's family**. A plan was devised to distribute

the funds over a set period of time. The Personnel Committee will be discussing options for janitorial service. Our members were very generous to our Disaster Relief collection. By supplementing the collection from Festival tithing proceeds, it was decided to give a total of \$3,000 to three relief agencies, of which \$2,000 will go to the International Orthodox Christian Charities. Our Metropolis of New Jersey is hosting the National **Philoptochos Children's Medical Fund Luncheon** and a donation in support of the initiative was passed. CPR/ AED (defibrillator) training by Parish Council Members is planned for the near future.

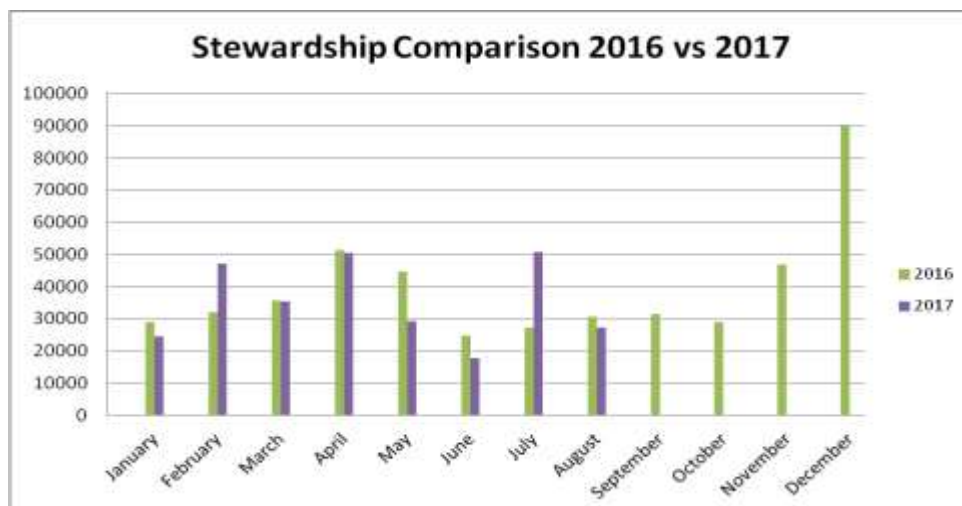

September 2017 Stewardship Report

In a few weeks, we will kick off our new Stewardship campaign for 2018. I am pleased to report that, as the graph below shows, we are continuing to have success in our Stewardship giving and we are now on track to having a strong finish for the year. We are presently \$7,126 ahead of our 2016 results, year-to-date, but we fell behind our pace in August after a spectacular July. Thank you for your continued love and support you regularly give to our Cathedral.

Looking ahead to 2018, our Stewardship objective will be the same as it has been for the past few years: to achieve 100% of our Operating expense through Stewardship giving; a goal I am confident we can, must, and will achieve. We have much to be thankful for and our Parish community has demonstrated its overwhelming support for the many



missions the Cathedral offers. The Stewardship Committee will be unveiling some new materials including new **monthly messages that are geared toward better expressing our message in a less “financial” way.** It is our objective to make the Stewardship message one that better embraces our operational ministries and mission, not just focused on numbers.

So, as we embark on a new Ecclesiastical year, I encourage everyone to reflect and remember that it is our **Stewardship program’s objective to cover the entire Parish Ministries and Operating Budget.** Thank you for your continued love and support you regularly give to our Cathedral.

Community Outreach Ministry looks to broaden its horizon

The Community Outreach Ministry committee is looking to expand its membership and broaden its involvement in the Richmond metro area.

“We’ve had a very productive and successful year,” said Jim Katsaros, committee chairman. “Our members have found creative ways to help those in need and they continue to surprise me every month with their sensitivity and enthusiasm. I hope this fall we can add new members and expand our ministry even further. I believe Outreach should always be a core part of our Church mission.”

To help solicit members, the committee sponsored the coffee hour on September 10. Tables were set up in the Dombalis Hall, and information was handed out about the various ministry programs. These include: a school supply drive; a **FeedMore “gadget” drive**; a stuffed-animal program for residents at Westport Rehabilitation and Nursing Center; the International Orthodox Christian Charities Emergency Response bucket program; the sponsorship of a John B. Cary Elementary School child in need to attend the Westview on the James Christian Camp; the IOCC fundraiser tennis tournament; and many more.

Our Outreach Ministry continues to sponsor monthly home-cooked meals for The Reinhart House, which provides housing to out-of-towners visiting loved ones at **St. Mary’s Hospital Intensive Care Unit**. The Cathedral Choir sponsored the August meal and the Community Outreach Ministry committee members sponsored the September meal. The September meal marked the 24th consecutive month that members of the

Cathedral family have provided this service – other Cathedral organizations are encouraged to participate in this important Ministry. For more information, contact Greg Silvestri.

On September 17, the Community Outreach Ministry committee also provided a jambalaya-themed meal for guests at the Hunter Holmes McGuire Veterans

Administration Hospital’s Fisher House. The committee provides meals to the Fisher House each spring and fall, as well as festival meals donated **twice per year. Fisher’s mission** is similar to the Reinhart House, contact Mark Chronis for more information.

Committee member Calypso Bletsos worked with Father Nicholas and Youth Director Dean Tiggas to welcome back college students on September 17. Returning students at the University of Richmond and Virginia Commonwealth University received gift packages at a luncheon in their honor. The ministry committee **also sent “care packages” to the new college freshman** from the community.


On behalf of the Outreach Committee, Beth Ann Lucas sends thanks all who **participated in this year’s** school supply drive. Most of the requested supplies were collected and distributed to the teachers who requested them. The drive benefited teachers at John B. Cary Elementary

School and our parishioners who teach in the Richmond metropolitan area.
